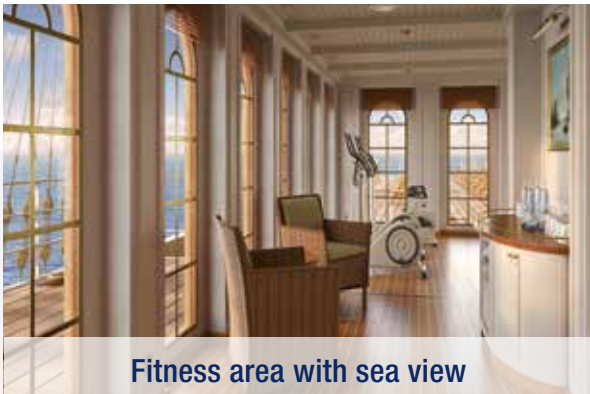
## A windjammer that sets new standards

Besides a sail area of 4,100 m<sup>2</sup> (44,100 sq ft), she is equipped with two economic diesel-electric drives that reliably keep her on course even during calms.

## THE SEVEN LIVES OF THE SEA CLOUD

Money was not an issue when Wall Street broker Edward Francis Hutton commissioned the “Hussar” in 1931. Concerning the interior of what at the time was the largest private sailing yacht in the world, he gave free reign to his wife, the glamorous Marjorie Merriweather Post. She furnished the four-master with a sure sense of style and carefully chosen antiques and thus gave the ship its distinctive character. At least nine months of the year, the Huttons spent at sea heading for the most exotic destinations.

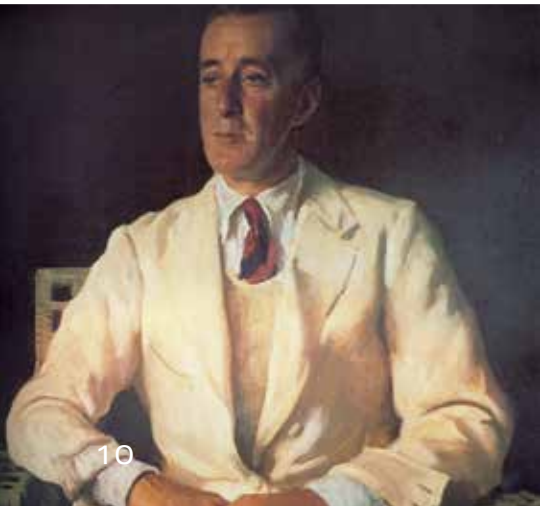






## A new life under a new name

But their life in the lap of luxury soon became clouded: In 1935, the affluent couple got divorced, and Ed Hutton signed the “Hussar” over to his ex-wife. She had the previously black hull painted white and also gave her yacht a new name: The “Hussar” became



the SEA CLOUD. And before the end of that year, Marjorie got married to her old friend Joseph E. Davies. Henceforth, the attractive socialite moved not only in the circles of economic magnates but also became familiar with the world of politics and diplomacy. When Davies took on the position of U.S. ambassador in Moscow in 1937, the SEA CLOUD was ordered to Leningrad as a floating (and bug-proof) diplomatic palace.

Marjorie excelled at socialising within the diplomatic scene. Besides the Soviet notables, several crowned heads, among others from the Swedish and Belgian royal dynasties, happily accepted her invitations on board. But when Davies was appointed U.S. ambassador in Belgium in June 1938, the SEA CLOUD had to bid the USSR farewell.

## A yacht's war service

Few guests only are aware of the significance of the small plaque that is affixed to the face side of the wheel house: Each of the five brass angles indicates six months of active war service for the USA. After the U.S. entered the war in 1941, the Navy began to acquire private yachts to reinforce the fleet; and Marjorie and Joe Davies committed the

SEA CLOUD to the Coast Guard for the symbolic charter of one dollar – opinions differ whether this was from a patriotic sense of duty or due to economic necessity. With demounted masts and a grey coat of paint, the erstwhile proud luxury yacht cruised between the Azores and Greenland as a floating weather station.

## Back to new splendour

After the end of the war, the refurbishment of the SEA CLOUD was to take almost four years: Only in 1949, the windjammer, freshly painted white again, received an entire set of new sails. When she first appeared on the horizon under

full sail, Joe said to Marjorie: “Well, dear, there goes your baby.” But meanwhile, someone else also coveted Marjorie’s baby: Rafael Leónidas Trujillo Molina, dictator of the Dominican Republic.

## Retirement for a “Queen of the Seas”

In 1955, Trujillo bought the ship and renamed it “Angelita”. Mostly, his son Ramfis used the presidential yacht – for parties with Hollywood stars like Zsa Zsa Gabor and Joan Collins. When Trujillo was shot dead on 30 May, 1961, a revolution unsettled his country. Carrying the dead body, part of the Trujillo clan and enormous amounts of cash, the “Angelita” set sail for Cannes. But the new government forced the crew to

turn around: The expensive heirloom was renamed “Patria” and put up for sale again. Five years later, the Operation Sea Cruises Inc. under John Blue bought the ship. However, when the “Antarna” – that was the yacht’s new name – entered the U.S. on the return journey from Naples, there was trouble with the authorities, and the “Antarna” was impounded. This was when Stephanie Gallagher appeared on the scene: At just 26

years of age, she was obsessed with the idea of an “Oceanic School” and academic learning at sea. Although “Oceanics” settled all unpaid invoices, John Blue retained the ship’s papers. Stephanie Gallagher set sail nevertheless – and was now chased as a “pirate”. In Panama, Blue finally came on board accompanied by attorneys and the police. Stephanie Gallagher had no choice but to give up.



## Renaissance of a dream yacht

For eight years, the “Antarna” was berthed unprotected in the port of Colón and exposed to the damp climate. But she was not forgotten by the enthusiasts for proud sailing ships. One such aficionado was the German Hartmut Paschburg, sea captain and economist. Together with a group of merchants from Hamburg, he purchased the luxury yacht –

and gave her back her old name, **SEA CLOUD**. But the hardest piece of work was yet to come: Captain Paschburg had to bring the yacht home across the Atlantic. In 1978, he gathered 40 men and women and together, they made the dilapidated yacht seaworthy again, then sailing her back to Hamburg. The Howaldts-werke-Deutsche Werft AG in Kiel

carried out the extensive overhauling and alteration work; and eight months later in 1979, the **SEA CLOUD**, now reflagged, went on her first cruise. Since her latest refurbishment in 2011, the windjammer not only conforms to the up-to-date SOLAS regulations (Safety Of Life At Sea) but shines in new splendour – as timelessly elegant as ever.

## Setting the sails by hand

On the two windjammers, the sails are still traditionally hoisted by hand – a tough job every time. Deftly, the sailors climb into the shrouds, release the heavy cloth, then vigorously tighten the ropes down on deck. There are no buttons that can simply be pressed: Almost an hour goes by before all sails billow in the wind.





## Feel the wind and the sea: Right up close to the elements

The scent of salt in your nose, the sound of the waves in your head, and on your skin the touch of the wind that gets caught in the huge sailcloth above: On board a **SEA CLOUD**, you get right up close to the elements. Here, the sea is always almost within your reach – not a dozen decks away!







## In sync with nature

Rather than fighting against it with engine power, we put the wind to good use – proving that great experiences and a positive environmental balance do not contradict each other. Whenever possible, the yachts run under sail. And if that means slight changes to the course due to weather conditions, the captain is happy to oblige.

## Across the Atlantic under billowing sails

## What exactly are the trade winds?

When, close to the equator, the sun is almost vertical in the sky, it shines straight down heating the air above the ocean surface. Once warm, this air rises and moves towards the poles on both sides of the equator.

## Perfect sailing conditions

At around 30° north and 30° south, the masses of air have cooled to such an extent that they sink again and return to the equator in the form of steady westerly winds, known as the trade winds. This is what carries the **SEA CLOUDS** across the Atlantic with constant force.

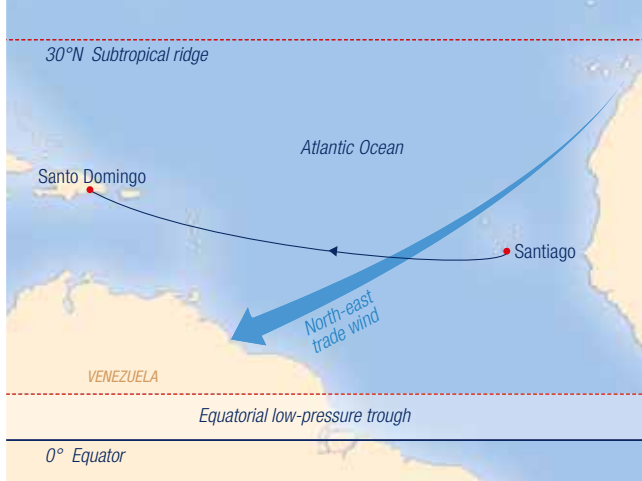

### An enchanted farewell to Lisbon

History comes alive in the city of Cádiz. One of Europe's oldest cities, this charming harbour town boasts a beautiful cathedral and baroque buildings, a tranquil old town and defiant watch towers. **Insider tip in the Aegean Sea: Astypalea**  
 Seen from above, Astypalea looks just like a butterfly that has landed on the blue Aegean waters. The little island jewel has kept its authentic charm to this day: Among innumerable beaches, the crystal clear water, bright white lanes and red windmill roofs, visitors will soon become one with the relaxed Greek island routine.

### Ancient Mycenae

Mycenae is a town steeped in history and legend. ### Hydra: a true individual

Fishing boats and luxury yachts, galleries and donkey-drawn carts – on Hydra the past meets modern art, rustic charm and effortless style in a way that is truly unique. The entire small island, with its traditional merchants' and captains' houses, is listed as a heritage site. As cars are forbidden there, this little gem has a timeless feel that has been perfectly preserved.

### Butrint: a UNESCO World Heritage Site

Visible from the island of Corfu, the ruined city of Butrint lies protected on a peninsula. Butrint is a kaleidoscope of Mediterranean history; as one of the trade centres of the ancient world, the city attracted numerous conquerors and travellers throughout the millennia. Excavations have unearthed theatres, temples and baths from the Greek, Roman, Byzantine, Venetian and Ottoman periods. Consequently in 1992 UNESCO declared Butrint a World Heritage Site.

### The Florence of the South: Lecce

Lecce, situated on the heel of the Italian boot in the ruggedly romantic Apulia region, is considered one of the most beautiful towns in southern Italy. Thanks to a special form of tuff stone, the town evolved into a splendid baroque city with its richly decorated facades gleaming in white and gold. ## A spectacular fjordscape, elegant seaside resorts, and magical ports steeped in history: Venice – Dubrovnik

### Ravenna – the city of mosaics

Ravenna is a real treasure chest, bursting with magnificent mosaics and well-preserved monuments, including eight UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The Basilica of San Vitale is one such example. Although unremarkable from the outside, its mesmerising interior is covered from floor to ceiling in thousands of glistening tiles.

### Zadar: more than 2,000 years of history

With its modern promenade, which replaced the monotonous concrete harbour wall, Zadar has been given a new lease of life. The city's pride and joy is the unique sea organ from which the waves coax deep soft sounds. On its steps, you can relax after strolling through the fortified old town with the monumental Church of St Donatus, the square of five wells, and four medieval gates.

### Between modernity and tradition: Bari

The wide boulevard Corso Emanuele II in Bari connects two very different worlds. While magnificent patrician houses and elegant shops dominate the new town, history comes alive in the old town with its labyrinth of narrow lanes. Most of this quarter has been reconstructed and so, modern tavernas and young galleries can now be found besides the Castello Svevo and numerous Apulian-Romanic churches.

### Sail through the Bay of Kotor

The emerald-green Gulf of Kotor sprawls over nearly 30 kilometres (18.6 miles) between rugged cliffs. The impressive bay cuts deep into the coast of Montenegro, creating a spectacular fjordscape.

## Tales of Greek history and legends – sail the seas of Odysseus: Dubrovnik – Athens (Piraeus)

### Butrint: a UNESCO World Heritage Site

Visible from the island of Corfu, the ruined city of Butrint lies protected on a peninsula. Butrint is a kaleidoscope of Mediterranean history; as one of the trade centres of the ancient world, the city attracted numerous conquerors and travellers throughout the millennia. Excavations have unearthed theatres, temples and baths from the Greek, Roman, Byzantine, Venetian and Ottoman periods. Consequently in 1992 UNESCO declared Butrint a World Heritage Site.

### Elizabeth’s favourite island – Corfu

Corfu found fame as a popular traveller’s destination as early as the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Bored of life at court, Empress Elisabeth of Austria travelled to the island and chose it to realise her dreams. She ordered a palace to be built in the style of Greek mythology and dedicated it to her favourite hero, Achilles. It is called the Achilleion.

### Ancient Mycenae

Mycenae is a town steeped in history and legend. When Heinrich Schliemann began excavating an acropolis site here in 1876, he discovered 13 kilos of golden treasure, including Agamemnon’s alleged death mask. The monumental Lion Gate, the Cyclopean masonry and the Treasury of Atreus are what make Mycenae one of the most important archaeological sites in modern-day Greece.

Together with the basilica and the Temple of Athena, they form the Doric heart of Paestum. Until its rediscovery in 1750, this Greek and later Roman colony had been hidden in the marsh and today is among the best preserved temple sites in Europe.

## Baroque splendour, Sicilian gold and Mediterranean charm – a voyage to the island treasures of the Mediterranean Sea: Malta – Valencia

### Syracuse: UNESCO World Heritage Site

Cicero once described Syracuse as “the greatest and most beautiful of the Greek cities”. Up to a million people – three times the population of mighty Athens – are claimed to have lived there in antiquity. This city on the small island of Ortigia was later conquered first by the Romans, then by Arabs, Byzantines and Normans. They have left behind a unique architectural heritage: UNESCO declared Syracuse a World Heritage Site in 2005 due to its archaeological importance.

### A masterwork of mosaics: the Cappella Palatina

The narrow streets of Palermo’s historic centre with their rattling Vespa scooters and vivacious market women lead to the impressive Norman palace. Inside it you will find the famous Cappella Palatina. Its richness is simply overwhelming: The erstwhile royal chapel is decorated with elements of both Christian and Islamic style, artistic carvings and marble floors. It contains an inner room which is entirely covered with precious golden mosaics.

### La Seu – Palma’s Gothic cathedral

In 1230, at a site once occupied by a mosque, construction work began on the famous cathedral of St Maria in Palma de Mallorca, otherwise known as “La Seu”. Initially built in a pure Gothic style, with spires stretching up to the sky, this cathedral was given a few “modern” touches over the course of the centuries. And at the beginning of the 20th century some of the building’s interior rooms were redesigned by none other than Gaudí.

This circular submarine sinkhole, with a diameter of over 300 metres (0.19 miles), was formed during the last ice age and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. ### Maya cities in Mexico and Belize

The sophisticated culture of the Maya in Central America, which began roughly 5,000 years ago and ended around the time of the Spanish conquest, is still a mystery. Their ceremonies seem to have been gory, their step pyramids imposing, and their stone carvings required a great deal of skill. On our trip you will discover three mystical Maya strongholds: Tulum, in Mexico, is the only Maya city situated on the coast; Altun Ha and Lamanai are located in Belize. Constructed on the banks of an inland lagoon, Lamanai remained populated for roughly 3,000 years. Excavations have revealed that over 20,000 people lived there around 700 AD.

## Perfect summer days in winter among green volcanoes, tropical gardens and white beaches: Barbados – St Maarten

### Grenada – the island of spice

Although Grenada has been blessed with around 45 picture-perfect beaches, the country's real treasure remains its lush, green island interior. Deep volcanic lakes, dense rainforests, waterfalls and small river courses form the primordial backdrop for the island's sugar cane fields and spice plantations. Not surprising that the scent of cloves, cinnamon and nutmeg hangs in the air wherever you go on Grenada.

### The magnificent Pitons of St Lucia

Gros and Petit Piton, the two famous volcanic plugs that tower over St Lucia, could have come straight out of a tropical storybook. They are a UNESCO World Heritage Site and offer a spectacular panorama as the SEA CLOUD II sails closely alongside their slopes.

### Colourful Caribbean underwater world

Eye to eye with parrotfishes, ocean turtles and damselfishes – the Tobago Cays and St Lucia are considered the best diving and snorkelling haunts in the Caribbean. ### French flair on the Îles des Saintes

This small archipelago, which earned its place in history as the Gibraltar of the Caribbean, has been a great source of contention over the years. It finally became French territory in 1816. Nowadays, the only remnant of these troubled times is an old fort. Life here is peaceful, as relaxed as the rest of the Caribbean, and spiced with a touch of savoir-vivre. Take a stroll through the small town on the island of Terre-de-Haut and discover all its little shops, before taking a break in one of the splendid restaurants or cafés.

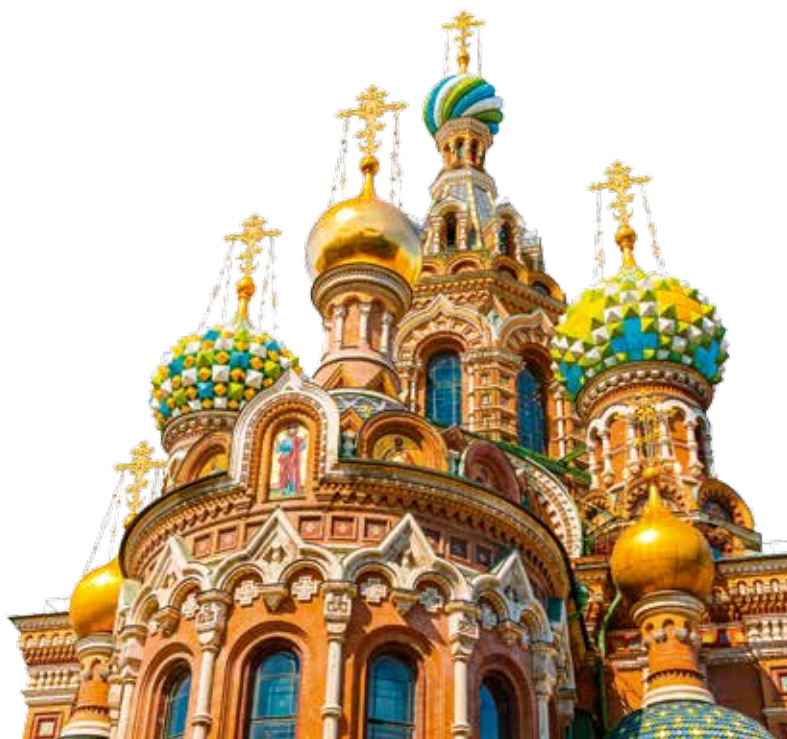

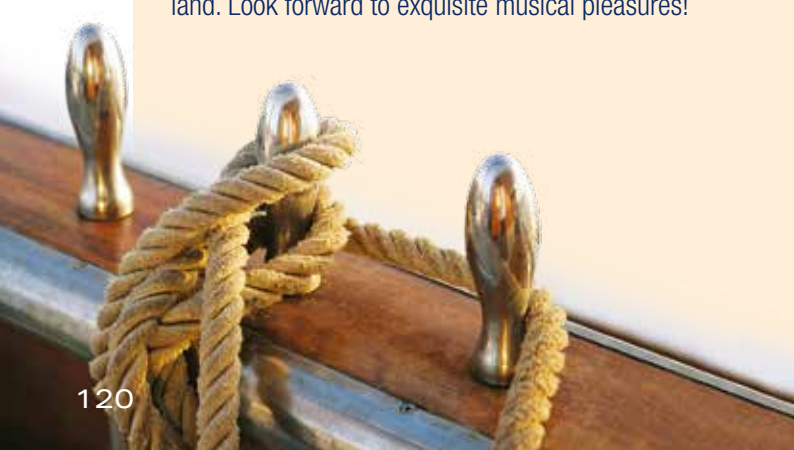

## Antique, baroque, and romantic – Italian impressions between Sicily, Apulia and Venice: Malta – Venice

### Syracuse: UNESCO World Heritage Site

Cicero once described Syracuse as “the greatest and most beautiful of the Greek cities”. Up to a million people are claimed to have lived there in antiquity. This city on the small island of Ortygia was later conquered first by the Romans, then by Arabs, Byzantines and Normans. They have left behind a unique architectural heritage: UNESCO declared Syracuse a World Heritage Site in 2005 due to its archaeological importance.

### The Florence of the South: Lecce

Lecce, situated on the heel of the Italian boot in the ruggedly romantic Apulia region, is considered one of the most beautiful towns in southern Italy. Thanks to a special form of tuff stone, the town evolved into a splendid baroque city with its richly decorated facades gleaming in white and gold. In Otranto there is no better way to see out the day than with a stroll through the lively old town.

### Zadar: more than 2,000 years of history

With its modern promenade, which replaced the monotonous concrete harbour wall, Zadar has been given a new lease of life. The city’s pride and joy is the unique sea organ from which the waves coax deep soft sounds. On its steps, you can relax in the evening after strolling through the fortified old town with the monumental Church of St Donatus, the square of five wells, and four medieval gates.

### An ancient multicultural city: Trieste

Trieste’s colourful history is reflected in its cuisine: From palatschinke to souvlaki, prosciutto to baccalà mantecato, the town has been shaped by the culinary influences of Austria, Istria and Greece. Trieste has long been considered a cultural melting pot; once a key port on the Slovenian border, it used to attract merchants from all over the world.

## Indulgement for all senses – culinary and cultural discoveries between Tuscany, Southern France and Spain: Naples – Valencia

### Lucca, the treasure chest of Tuscany

The trade in precious silks is what originally made Lucca rich. When you take a stroll along the 16<sup>th</sup>-century town wall in the shade of old plane trees, the grandeur of composer Giacomo Puccini’s birthplace really becomes apparent. In the centre, which is almost free of cars, an opulent panorama unfolds made up of Roman lanes, churches and cupolas, wide squares and stately town palaces.

The historical trade hub owes its riches in art and architecture to the Medici family, who promoted artists like Botticelli and Michelangelo and erected impressive architectural gems such as the Basilica di San Lorenzo.

### Living Provençal style in Aix

Its successful blend of baroque elegance and a lively student scene is one of the reasons why Aix-en-Provence ranks amongst France’s top five of the most popular places to live. Stroll under the old plane trees of the famous Cours Mirabeau for a taste of this Provençal capital’s history; its main boulevard is lined with small bistros and antique shops, elegant residences, fountains and boutiques.

## En route to the Cape Verde Islands discovering their fascinating nature- and culturescapes: Las Palmas – Santiago

### El Hierro – the most pristine of the Canary Islands

Little El Hierro with its tranquil villages is the perfect island to unwind. Far from the bustle of the Canaries, walkers and hikers find here their perfect natural paradise. From steep cliffs to green highlands, from lava deserts to mystical cloud forests, this small volcanic island of just 278 square kilometres (107 square miles) features the most diverse natural landscapes and temperate zones.

### The rich cultural mix of Cape Verde

Not just geographically, Cape Verde is situated between Africa, the Caribbean and Europe. The Portuguese colony was a hub of the slave trade and exile for the religiously persecuted. Since 1461, customs, musical traditions and genes have amalgamated to the entirely new Creole culture. In 1975, the República Cabo Verde proudly declared its independence.

### São Vicente – native island of Cesária Évora

Violin sounds mingle with African drums, Fado meets Polka and creates musical styles like Morna, Batuque and Funaná: The Cape Verde Islands are a melting pot of world music. Cesária Évora from lively Mindelo was the isles' most famous singer. Barefoot and with a sweet melancholy, she sang of love, hurt and hope and is still revered today as the "Queen of Morna".

### Santo Antão, the island of contrast

The second largest island of Cape Verde enchants with its spectacular natural diversity. While the volcanic craters in the barren south are reminiscent of moonscapes, rocky mountainous landscapes alternate with green and fertile valleys in the north. Besides pineapples, mango trees and coconut palms, sugar cane is also grown here – and distilled into the national schnaps Grogue.

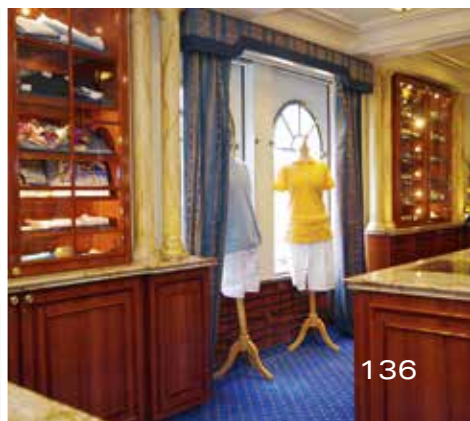
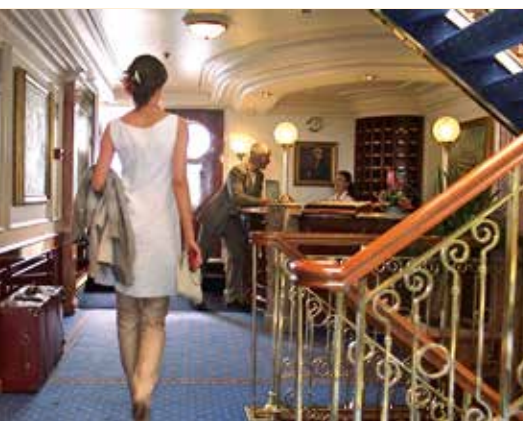
# The SEA CLOUD II Deck Plan

The languages used on board are German and English. Daily programmes, menus and announcements will be available in both languages. Depending on the group, we always endeavour to organise German or English-speaking tour guides for our shore excursions.

### Laundry:

Our washing and ironing service is provided at an additional charge and carried out overnight. For guests staying in cat. A-C cabins (**SEA CLOUD**) or cat. A+B cabins (**SEA CLOUD II**), this service is provided free of charge.

### Massage/beauty treatments:

For your own personal comfort, we provide a range of spa services on board the **SEA CLOUD II** (massages and beauty treatments at an extra charge), using the finest products from Maria Galland.

### Medical advice:

The **SEA CLOUD** and the **SEA CLOUD II** both have on-board hospitals managed by the ship's doctor, who is available at any time in the event of an emergency. Our yachts are not equipped with lifts/elevators so that guests have to use the stairs; embarkation and debarkation is via the on-board gangway and is not always level; depending on the tide, access might be steep. Unshipping with the on-board tenders or zodiacs is also via the gangway. Before embarking on one of our voyages, you should therefore be positive that you are in good physical health. If you are unsure whether you will be able to manage the conditions on board, please contact us. Specific care must be agreed upon in advance.

### On-board programme:

Of course, sailing manoeuvres and seafaring skills take centre stage on board a true windjammer. As of late, you can join in yourself when the sails are hoisted, for example work the clew lines and buntlines when striking the sails or coil the rope ends when clearing the deck. Lecturers and artists are also on board on selected voyages, offering stimulating talks or additional entertainment. An on-board pianist will be playing on both ships during our afternoon coffee service and in the evenings. In addition, guests can borrow books

(in both English and German), popular board games, as well as DVDs (**SEA CLOUD II** only).

Furthermore, we offer stand up paddle boards when going ashore on a beach, as well as a towable tube from the gangway.

**Terms and Conditions of Travel of the Company**  
**SEA CLOUD CRUISES GmbH in its capacity as Tour Organizer for**  
**SY SEA CLOUD and SY SEA CLOUD II**

Dear Guest,

We hope that you have found the appropriate vacation trip in our programme, and we welcome you to the exclusive circle of SEA CLOUD CRUISES GmbH (SCC) guests. Please read the following **Information and Conditions** carefully so that you will know exactly what you can expect from us. The information and conditions regulate the contractual relationship between you and us, and you shall recognize them with your reservation. We are striving to relieve you of troubles and worries in as far as humanly possible. The delineation of our responsibility is designed to provide clarity regarding what you may expect and our liability.

#### 1. Application and Travel Confirmation

- 1.1. Via your tour application, you are offering SCC, in a binding manner, the opportunity to close a travel agreement. Your tour registration may transpire in writing. The travel agreement will only become binding from the time that we confirm the reservation and the price to you or your travel agent in writing.
- 1.2. The applicant is liable for all contractual obligations of other tour participants that he/she registers provided that he/she has expressly confirmed to do so.
- 1.3. You shall receive a travel confirmation upon conclusion of the contract or without delay thereafter. The confirmation shall contain all essential information regarding travel performances you have reserved, provided that said information does not already follow from the travel brochure.
- 1.4. All personal data, which you submit to us for handling your trip, is subject to the provisions of the General Data Protection Regulation and the Federal Data Protection Act. Data will be protected against improper use.
- 1.5. If the subject-matter of the confirmation of the holiday deviates from the subject-matter of the booking, then a new offer by SCC is in existence to which it is bound for the duration of 10 days. The contract comes into existence on the basis of this new offer if the traveller declares his/her acceptance to SCC in writing or by payment within the commitment period.

#### 2. Payment

- 2.1. You are required to make a down-payment of 10% per person within one week following receipt of the travel confirmation and the invoice. The remaining balance shall be due for payment four weeks prior to commencement of travel and before receipt of travel documents (tickets, etc.). The total amount is due for payment as soon as the travel confirmation, invoice and insurance certificate have been received in the event of bookings made when there are four weeks or less remaining before commencement of travel.
- 2.2. If the traveller is in default with a payment to SCC, SCC can cancel the contract after having issued a reminder with a deadline. In this case SCC can claim cancellation fees in accordance with paragraph 5.2.
- 2.3. The travel contract will be cancelled automatically if payment is not received by the beginning of travel despite another demand for payment by a certain date having been issued. In this instance, SCC will be entitled to demand corresponding cancellation charges as compensation for damages according to paragraph 5.2.
- 2.4. The customer is required to bear the cost of ancillary performances, such as acquiring a visa, etc., as well as the costs for reservations or inquiries made by telegraph or telephone.
- 2.5. All payments must be made directly to the operator specified on the invoice. **The travel agency is not authorized to receive payments.** Payments to the intermediary travel agency will be made at the traveller's own risk and will have no debt-discharging effect with respect to the relevant operator should the travel agency fail to forward the payments to the operator specified on the invoice.

#### 3. Performances and Prices

- 3.1. The scope of contractual performances arises from the services as specified in the offer and in the booking confirmation combined with the catalogue valid at the time and the trip description together with all explanations and guidelines contained therein.
- 3.2. Flights  
SCC informs the customer about the identity of the airline/s performing flight services during the voyage. In cases where the booking is made at a time when the airline is not known, SCC will tell the customer which airline/s is/are most likely to perform the flight services. As soon as SCC knows for certain which airline/s will be performing the flight services, SCC will inform the customer about the identity of the airline/s. At the very latest, this will be when the detailed travel information is sent. In case the airline changes SCC will inform the customer immediately after the change is known. A list of airlines with an operating ban within the EU can be found here: [https://ec.europa.eu/transport/modes/air/safety/air-ban\\_en](https://ec.europa.eu/transport/modes/air/safety/air-ban_en).  
The conditions of carriage of the airlines for whose flights we act as intermediary are binding. We shall be pleased to provide these to you on request.  
Carriage is booked in the Tourist Class; also in the Business or First Class at extra tariff cost in as far as they are available. Flights on days other than the travel days booked e.g. as a result of pre- or post-programmes can lead to extra costs. The airlines always only accept seat reservations as non-binding wishes.
- 3.3. Luggage conveyance  
Up to 20 kg luggage per flight passenger will be conveyed (First Class 30 kg). For travel to some countries (incl. USA, Canada, Mexico and within Germany) measurements are based not on the weight, but instead on the number of luggage items and their dimensions. Excess luggage can in principle be carried at extra cost. Children under the age of two have no claim to luggage conveyance.  
Please report damage or delays in delivery promptly on the spot to the relevant airline via a Property Irregularity Report (P.I.R.). The report is a prerequisite for any liability.
- 3.4. Services not used by traveller  
SCC shall endeavour to obtain reimbursement of saved costs from the service provider if the traveller fails to utilize travel services due to premature return journey and in other significant cases. This shall not apply if services are fully irrelevant or if a refund is opposed by legal or official regulations. SCC is entitled to retain 20% of the refundable amount as compensation for additional effort and expenses.

#### 4. Modification of Services and Prices

- 4.1. A change of airline company, of aircraft or of the departure and arrival airport may become necessary should an airline cancel a flight and e.g. in the event of failure of the airline to comply with the flight schedule. Right is retained to effect such kind of change or modification in such or similar instances.  
Only costs, equivalent to a second class railroad journey, will be refunded in the event of substitute transportation.
- 4.2. Changes in the trip's itinerary are possible for ship voyages, e.g. in case of floodings or low water level, inclement weather conditions, governmental regulations, if the vessel could not adhere to its schedule at the time that travel commences because of an unforeseen technical defect that causes postponement of the trip itinerary, if the vessel's management alters the vessel's course in the interest of passengers' safety or any other special reason related to the ship travel. In any such cases SCC has the right to make use of other means of transportation such as but not limited to coaches and buses for some routes.
- 4.3. Any such and comparable divergences from and modifications to individual travel performances contained in the travel agreement, which become necessary after the agreement is closed, and which are not induced by SCC contrary to the principles of good faith and trust, are solely permissible, if they are not substantial and if they do not impede the overall tailored style of the reserved trip.  
The modified performance shall supersede the performance due under contract. Contingent claims under warranty shall remain unaffected, in as far as substitute performance is flawed.  
In the event that the overall tailored style of the reserved trip is unreasonably modified due to said substitute performances, then we shall grant you the option to change your reservations, free of charge, or to cancel the travel agreement without paying any fees. SCC shall undertake to immediately inform you of any such divergences or modifications, in as far as possible.
- 4.4. SCC reserves the right to alter the indicated prices, which have been confirmed on booking, in the case of an increase of transportation costs or of fees for particular services, such as port or airport charges, bunker surcharges, insurance fees or in the case of an alteration of the exchange rates applicable to the holiday in question, to the extent to which this increase has an effect on the price of the holiday per person or per seat, provided more than four months lie between the conclusion of the contract and the stipulated date of the holiday.  
In the case of a subsequent amendment to the price of the holiday or of an amendment to an essential travel service, SCC must inform the traveller accordingly without delay, at the latest, however, 21 days before commencement of the holiday. Price increases after this period are not permissible. In the case of price increases of more than 5% or in the case of a considerable amendment to an essential travel service, the traveller is entitled to withdraw from the tourist travel contract free of charge or to demand to take a holiday which is at least of the same value, if the tour operator is in a position to offer such a holiday from its range of holidays at no extra cost for the traveller. The traveller must assert these rights vis-à-vis SCC within the time frame defined by SCC as part of the notification regarding the price increase or amendment to the travel service. If the traveller does not respond to SCC within the defined time frame or at all, the amendment about which they have been notified will be deemed to have been accepted. The traveller is to be made aware of this within a declaration by SCC via a permanent data medium such that it is emphasised in a clearly comprehensible way.

#### 5. Cancellation, Changing Reservations, Substitute Persons

- 5.1. You may cancel your trip in writing at any time prior to commencement of travel. Your cancellation notice shall become effective on the date we receive it. If we receive your notice out of office hours (Monday to Friday 9-17h CET), your notice shall become effective on the next working day (except Saturday).
- 5.2. If one of the parties cancels the contract or if you do not start the journey, SCC may demand reasonable compensation for arrangements it has made in conjunction with the trip and for its expenses, even if SCC has not yet confirmed the trip or if you fail to begin the journey. Our flat rate claim to reimbursement consists of a processing fee of EUR 25 per person for cancellation of a reserved trip up to 150 days prior to commencement of travel. The following annulment fees shall arise in the event of later cancellation:
  - 25% of the tour price for cancellation 149 – 50 days prior to commencement of travel;
  - 35% of the tour price for cancellation 49 – 22 days prior to commencement of travel;
  - 55% of the tour price for cancellation 21 – 15 days prior to commencement of travel;
  - 80% of the tour price for cancellation 14 days or less prior to commencement of travel;
  - 90% of the tour price for cancellation on the same day as the commencement of travel or failure to appear.Costs that the service provider charges to SCC, e.g., empty bed fee charged by a hotel for cancellation at short notice or special fees for cruises, shall be additionally invoiced in the event that individual or group trips are annulled.  
The traveller is free to prove to SCC that SCC has no loss or that the loss is less than the aforementioned flat rate. In this case the lower proven loss will be applied in place of the flat. SCC reserves the right to charge reimbursement fees beyond the flat rates mentioned above.  
In this case SCC has to verify and prove the loss, taking any expenses that have been saved and/or any other potential uses for the travel services into consideration.
- 5.3. We will endeavour to modify the travel registration (change reservations) subject to availability, at your request, up to 75 days prior to commencement of travel.  
Any change of reservations made as of the 74th day prior to commencement of travel will require you to serve notice that you are cancelling the reserved trip, and it will require subsequent re-registration. This shall not apply for requested changes of reservations that solely cause substantiated, minor expenses.  
Modification of the travel date, the travel destination, accommodations or the means of transportation shall apply as a change of reservations.
- 5.4. You may appoint a substitute person for yourself up to commencement of travel. In such case you are required to inform the tour organizer thereof. The tour organizer may object to any such substitute person on the basis of good cause, (e.g., special requirements linked to the trip, statutory bans, refusal by airlines or by hotel operators, etc.). If a third party enters into the contract, then he or she and the registrant are jointly and severally liable in respect of SCC for the price of the holiday and for additional costs incurred through the entry of the third party. SCC may only demand that additional costs be refunded if they are actually and reasonably incurred. SCC must provide the traveller with evidence of the amount of additional costs incurred through the entry of the third party.
- 5.5. Cancellation fees and fees for changing reservations are due for immediate payment.



## 6. Cancellation and Rescission of Agreement by the Tour Organizer

6.1. SCC may rescind the travel agreement after commencement of travel, without complying with a term of notice, if travellers persistently disturb execution of the trip despite an appropriate warning issued by the tour organizer. The same shall apply if anyone should behave in a manner which is gravely in breach of contract and justifies the immediate cancellation. In addition SCC has the right to cancel the travel contract without notice if in the captain's opinion the traveller is unfit for travel due to illness, physical disability or for any other reason or if the traveller requires special assistance but is travelling without this assistance or if the trip has been booked based on incorrect information. SCC shall, however, after cancellation retain its claim to the tour price. The person causing the disturbance is liable for any possible extra cost for return transportation.

However, SCC is required to allow credit for the value of saved costs as well as for advantages which may be obtained from another application of services not used, including possible reimbursements from service providers.

6.2. SCC may rescind the trip up to twenty days prior to commencement of travel due to failure to obtain the minimum number of participants if (a) the minimum number of participants in the brochure is stated as well as the point in time by which the traveller must be informed of the withdrawal prior to the contractually agreed-upon commencement of the travel and (b) the number of minimum participants as well as the latest date of possible cancellation are clearly stated in the travel confirmation or reference is made to the respective travel description where such information is stated. In case of a planned travel period of six days at the maximum it is sufficient if SCC rescinds the trip seven days prior to the commencement of the trip. The cancellation notice will be immediately forwarded to you. Your paid tour price will be immediately, latest after 14 days, refunded.

## 7. Rescission of the Contract due to unavoidable, exceptional circumstances

SCC or the traveller may both rescind the travel agreement if the trip or the carriage to the destination is rendered considerably difficult, endangered or impeded due to unavoidable, exceptional circumstances such as but not limited to an Act of Providence, (e.g., war, internal unrest, natural catastrophes that endanger safe travels to the destination) or in case of material risks for the health because of the outbreak of serious diseases at the destination. SCC shall immediately refund the paid tour price in such instance, latest after 14 days.

## 8. Liability

8.1. We shall bear liability within the scope of the due diligence of a prudent businessman:

8.1.1. for conscientious preparation of the trip;

8.1.2. for careful selection and monitoring of service providers, (e.g., transportation corporations, hotel operators, etc.);

8.1.3. for due and proper rendering of contractually covenanted tour performances, under consideration of applicable legal provisions of the respective country and place of destination.

8.2. However, we are not liable for information contained in hotel and local site brochures. We have no influence on their origin. We also bear no liability if national political conditions and contingent entry regulations change at the point of destination, after this brochure is printed, that encumber entry into the affected country or point of destination or which render the same infeasible. We shall inform you at short notice of any such essential, subsequent changes, in as far as possible.

8.3. We are liable for the fault of a person entrusted with rendering a service, unless otherwise stipulated under these Terms and Conditions of Travel or stipulated by prevailing conditions, and provided that the person entrusted to render service had caused an instance of damage not only upon the occasion of performing contract. The measure of indebted diligence shall be determined by conditions at the site of service rendered. Your tour will primarily take you to foreign countries, where foreign living conditions and where laws, that are partially foreign to us, prevail.

### 8.4. Warranty

8.4.1. The traveller may demand relief if the tour is not performed in compliance with contract. SCC may refuse relief if it necessitates disproportionate expense.

8.4.2. After returning from the tour, the traveller may demand reduction of the tour price, commensurate with reduced performance, in the event that the demand for relief was unsuccessful and the trip was not performed in compliance with contract. This shall not affect contingent, more extensive claims for subsequent reduction of the tour price.

8.4.3. The traveller may rescind the travel agreement if the tour organizer failed to perform relief, within a reasonable term, or if the tour organizer formally states that relief cannot be performed, and if the trip will be considerably impaired due to performance of services under noncompliance with contract. If the agreement is rescinded in this manner, then SCC is obligated to take appropriate measures, and especially to provide return transportation for travellers, if required.

8.5. The traveller may demand compensation for damages, and more precisely for vacation time spent to no avail, provided that the tour organizer is liable for a circumstance that caused a flaw in the tour.

### 8.6. Restriction of liability

8.6.1. The tour operator's contractual liability is limited to three times the tour price, provided that damages sustained by the traveller are not caused by intent or gross negligence. The same applies in as far as the tour organizer is responsible for damages incurred by a traveller solely through the fault of a service provider.

8.6.2. The tour organizer is not liable for defective performances that arise in conjunction with services mediated as third party performances, (e.g., sporting events, attendance at theatres, exhibitions, etc.), provided these services are expressly identified as third party performances in the brochure and the booking confirmation by giving the name and the address of the third parties. It must be clearly recognizable for the customer that these third party performances are not part of the package tour by SCC.

8.6.3. A claim to damage against SCC as tour organizer is restricted or excluded, if – under legal provisions applicable to required, rendered performances of a service provider – a claim for damage against a service provider may solely be asserted under certain conditions or limitations or if such claim is excluded under certain conditions.

8.6.4. If SCC assumes a position equivalent to a freight carrier, then his liability shall be regulated by the provisions of the Air Transportation Act in conjunction with conventions covenanted in Warsaw, The Hague, Guadalajara and the Montreal Agreement (solely for flights to Canada and the USA). As a rule, the Warsaw Convention limits the freight carrier's liability for death or physical injury and for loss and damage of luggage. If the tour organizer constitutes a service provider, in other instances, then he shall bear liability in accordance with provisions that apply for a service provider.

8.6.5. If SCC assumes a position equivalent to a carrier, within the scope of sea voyages, then his liability shall be regulated in compliance with provisions of the Commercial Code and the Inland Waterways Transportation Act.

## 8.7. Duty to cooperate, complaints

8.7.1. In the event of defective performance, each traveller is required to undertake whatever may be reasonably expected of him/her to contribute to alleviate the defect and to keep any potential damages to a minimum.

8.7.2. If you should have reason for complaints, contrary to our expectations, then immediately inform our tour management on site. If a respective local tour manager or tour agent is not available or cannot be reached, or if they cannot alleviate a defective performance, then please turn to the service provider (transfer company, hotel operator) and/or the tour organizer or to his contact address in the area of destination. A traveller is not entitled to claims if he/she culpably fails to perform the above obligations. The only time this does not apply is if reporting a complaint is clearly futile or unreasonable for other reasons. The customer will, however, be informed about the availability of the tour manager or SCC in the service description – at the latest when they receive the travel documents.

8.7.3. Tour guides are not authorized to formally recognize any claims whatsoever.

## 9. Exclusion of Claims and Statute of Limitation

9.1. If the baggage is damaged, lost or delayed during the travel by air, the passenger must write and complain to the relevant air carrier in loco as soon as possible with undue delay. The airlines and SCC may refuse to grant a refund due to international conventions if the claims notification therefor is not completed in time. The claims need to be asserted within seven days in case of loss of luggage and within 21 days after receipt of luggage in case of delay.

9.2. The traveller must assert claims under §§ 651 c to f BGB (German Civil Code) within a month after the contractual date of return.

9.3. All claims arising from the travel agreement as well as claims based on injury to life, limb or health due to intentional or negligent breach of duty of SCC shall lapse two years following the contractually covenanted date of return.

9.4. The statute of limitations is suspended if SCC initially states to you that complaints and claims are being examined. The suspension is lifted when the tour organizer informs the customer of the results of his examination with regard to the customer's claims.

## 10. Insurance Coverage

10.1. You are insured against transportation risk during flights, within the scope of lawful provisions.

10.2. For your own safety, we recommend that you take out a travel insurance policy that includes cancellation, interruption, health, luggage, accident and liability coverage.

## 11. Passport, Visa, Customs, Foreign Exchange and Health Regulations

11.1. You will receive essential information on the formalities required for your trip along with the travel offer. This information will be conveyed along with travel documents and through the travel description contained in the catalogue. Please heed this information, as each traveller is himself/herself responsible for compliance with these regulations. You shall bear all costs and the negative impact of failure to comply with said information.

11.2. You have to ensure that your passport, which you will require for your trip, is still valid, for a period of six months beyond the planned travel date. Children require a children's passport which is appropriate to the respective destination. This information applies for German citizens. Foreign nationals and holders of foreign passports are requested to turn to their relevant consulate or embassy for appropriate information.

11.3. You are liable to SCC for all consequences and damages, especially penalties, fees and expenses, that must be paid or deposited as a result of your failure to follow applicable regulations for entry into, exit out of or transit through a country, or if in case you have not provided the necessary documents or not provided them in the prescribed manner. You are obliged to immediately reimburse any funds that SCC must pay or deposit.

11.4. SCC is not liable for the necessary visas being granted or provided in time by the relevant diplomatic body with the exception of instances when SCC has been instructed to arrange them unless SCC has culpably failed to fulfil its own obligations.

## 12. General Remarks

12.1. Major printing errors and computational errors in the brochure or on the travel confirmation shall entitle SCC to avoid the validity of the travel agreement. In such instance, SCC is required to compensate the traveller for the proven loss incurred by relying on a declaration.

12.2. All information in our tour description corresponds to the current status of information at the time of printing.

12.3. Invalidity of individual provisions of the travel agreement shall not result in invalidity of the entire travel agreement. The same shall apply for these same Terms and Conditions of Travel.

12.4. Oral agreements are only valid if we have confirmed them in writing.

12.5. The conditions of the respective shipowner or transportation corporation shall apply in the event of travel by ship, combined air and ship travel, combined train and ship travel and for bus trips. We will provide you with a copy of their conditions upon request.

12.6. German law is solely applicable to the contractual relationship between the traveller and SCC.

12.7. The Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg is deemed venue for courts of law for all registered businessmen, and for persons who do not have a domestic place of jurisdiction, as well as for persons who moved their place of residence or usual abode to a foreign country, after closing the travel agreement, or whose place of residence or usual abode is not known at the time that a suit is filed, and for litigation as a defendant.

12.8. SCC does not participate in the voluntary procedure for alternative dispute resolution for customer disputes in accordance with the Customer Dispute Resolution Law (Verbraucherstreitbeilegungsgesetz) and is not obliged to do so.

12.9. At the point of booking, SCC collects the personal data of the traveller that is required for the purpose of fulfilling and performing the travel contract. SCC stores this data electronically as well as processing it and forwarding it on to third parties (e.g. service providers such as hotels and transportation companies) if required within the scope of the contract.
